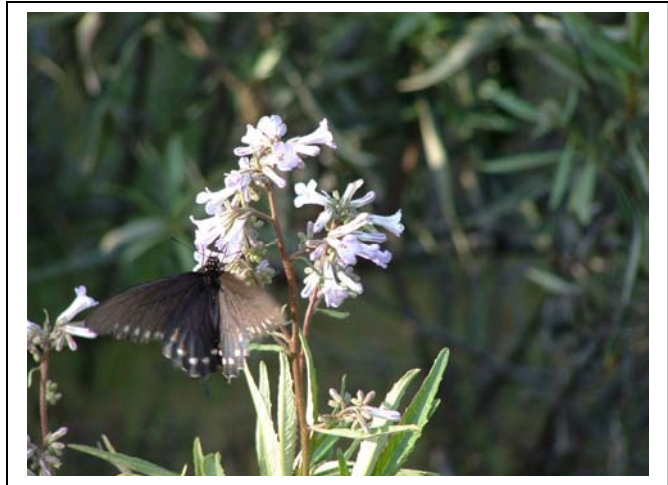


Pollinator Friendly Plants
